***Cash Bail in California is an immoral practice. Prop 25 replaces that system with a problematic "risk assesment" tool that still creates pretrial discrimination. **Opponents of cash bail are divided on this Proposition, with valid arguments for "yes" and "no" recommendations.** UJMCAs has opted to issue a qualified "Yes," aware that this risk assessment system is still unjust and harmful, but has potential to be less harmful than current cash bail practices. Regardless of the outcome of this Proposition, we remain committed to ending cash bail and the racism inherent to pretrial detention and mass incarceration.
